



Which documents are necessary for enrollment?

Birth certificate reports of the last attended school, international vaccination card (proof of inoculation against measles), letter of recommendation by a previous teacher (e. g. German teacher) and possible confirmations of language courses.

Can you join during the school year?

In exceptional cases it is possible to join during the school year.

What is the procedure of enrollment like?

1. Call the secretary's office of Städtisches Lion-Feuchtwanger-Gymnasium (089.350301.0) or of Städtisches Werner-von-Siemens-Gymnasium (089.2333500.0) to arrange for a first interview.
2. First interview between a teacher, parent(s) or legal guardian(s) and the student.
3. Central German test (oral and written) after the Whitsun/Pentecost holidays carried out by both grammar schools.
4. Acceptance or rejection by the schools.
5. Entry into Städtisches Lion-Feuchtwanger-Gymnasium or Städtisches Werner-von-Siemens-Gymnasium in September

What are international classes (i-classes)?

Students who have been in Germany for only one or two years can enroll in the international classes as guest students if they currently attend a German *Mittelschule*, i. e. secondary school. Students arriving directly from abroad can also enroll if they already have good knowledge of German. The i-classes are full-time classes whose focus lies on German lessons as well as more lessons in some other main subjects of grammar school or high school, i. e. the German Gymnasium. Additionally, the i-classes can be taught by two teachers in the main subjects.

Students follow the same curriculum as regular classes, but they have more time to do so due to full-time schooling.

The i-classes are smaller than regular classes.

After one year there is an entrance examination. Having proven the necessary qualification for the *Gymnasium*, the guest students can be enrolled as regular students. If this is not the case, the status of being a guest student is terminated, and further counselling (e. g. offered by the *Educational Counselling for People from Abroad* of the City of Munich) and consequently changing school are necessary. There might be the possibility of attending an international class at a *Realschule*, i. e. a secondary/junior high school.

The reports of the i-classes correspond to the reports of regular classes.

The i-classes address students who are qualified to attend the German *Gymnasium* and show the willingness to deliver maximum performance. The maximum age for entering is set up in the GSO § 2 (2). The GSO is the School Regulations for the *Gymnasium*.

According to the GSO § 15 (3) the curriculum of foreign languages can be changed in favour of the student's mother tongue or native language once he or she is registered as a regular student in years 7 to 11.

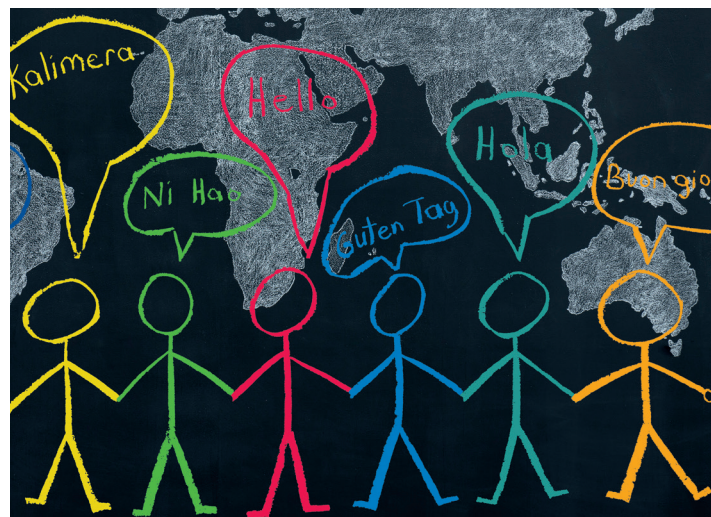
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Which grades can you enroll in?

In the school year 2020/21 the schools start with one class in grade 6 and in grade 8. In the following school years grades 5 to 9 are going to be offered as well.



How many places are available?

The classes have 25 places. In subsequent years the number depends on the number of pupils leaving the current classes.

Which knowledge of German is required?

The students have to prove sufficient knowledge of German in an entrance examination. This level can also be acquired in advance in German classes, language courses, in the family or in language classes in schools of different nations.

You do not have sufficient knowledge of German?

In this case the *Städtische Bildungsberatung* International of the City of Munich (Educational Counselling for People from Abroad) offers consultation and counselling.

Another common option for language courses are the German language classes of the Mittelschule and the SPRINT classes of the Realschule.

An alternative to the i-classes is the project InGym at Staatliches Wilhelm-Hausenstein-Gymnasium and the classes promoting language learning at Städtisches Adolf-Weber-Gymnasium.

Any further qualification needed?

Ideally, the qualification for higher education should have already been attained in the country of origin, i. e. good knowledge of math and of the native language are minimum requirements.
